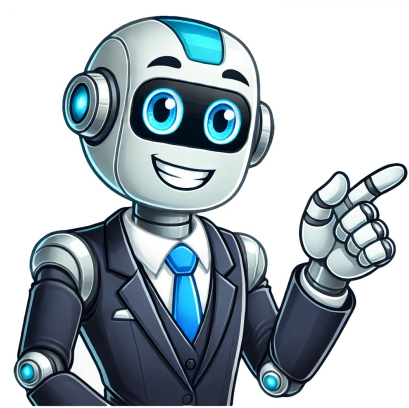

Also, they handle advanced training and responsibilities. It almost takes six hours for an RN & 5 hours for the PN examination.
